<u>PLNHLC 2009-01346, Eastside Apartments New Construction</u> – (Unfinished Business) A request by PEG Development for final design approval for New Construction located at approximately 556 East 300 South. The subject property is located in an RMF-35 (Moderate Density Multi-Family Residential), RO (Residential Office) and RMU (Residential Mixed-Use) zoning districts, all proposed to be rezoned to RMU.
