Westmoreland Place Historic District National Register Nomination — A request by Beatrice Lufkin, Consultant, soliciting comments from the Historic Landmark Commission regarding listing the locally-designated historic district on the National Register of Historic Places. The property is generally located between 1500 and 1600 East and 1300 South and the south side of Harrison Avenue. The presentation will include a discussion of the findings of the recently completed Reconnaissance Level Survey for the area. The property is zoned R-1-7000 (Single-Family Residential District) and is within City Council District 5, represented by Jill Remington Love. The site is located in the Westmoreland Place Historic District and the R 1-7000 Single Family Residential zoning district, and is within City Council District 5, represented by Jill Remington Love.
