6. <u>Trolley Square Water Tower Signs at approximately 602 East 500 South - SK Hart</u> Management, represented by Lynn Attwood, AIA, is requesting approval from the City to reface the existing movie theater signs on the north and south sides of the water tower and install electronic message signs. This type of project must be reviewed for a Certificate of Appropriateness for a major alteration in a Historic District. 7. <u>Trolley Square Site Improvements at approximately 602 East 500 South</u> - SK Hart Management, represented by Lynn Attwood, AIA, is requesting approval from the City to improve various public spaces within the Trolley Square property. Possible improvements include, but are not limited to: new trellis features, new awnings, new lawn, new lighting fixtures, enhancements to existing entrances, portable shade structures and other minor site features. There are no changes proposed to any of the buildings as part of this petition. Currently the land is used as a shopping center and is zoned CS (Community Shopping). This type of project is a minor alteration but cannot be approved administratively by staff. Therefore, review by the Historic Landmark Commission is required. The proposal would convert the sign from externally illuminated to internally illuminate. No changes to the size or shape of the sign are proposed. The property is zoned SR-1A (Special Development Pattern Residential) CB (Community Business). The district extends along South Temple from approximately 100 East to 1350 East. Appeal Of Historic Landmark Commission Decision: The applicant, any owner of abutting property or of property located within the same H historic preservation overlay district, any recognized or registered organization pursuant to title 2, chapter 2.62 of this code, the Utah State Historical Society or the Utah Heritage Foundation, aggrieved by the Historic Landmark Commission's decision, may object to the decision by filing a written appeal with the appeals hearing officer within ten (10) calendar days following the date on which a record of decision is issued.
