1. <u>300 West Median Islands and Intersections Upgrades</u> – The Redevelopment Agency of Salt Lake City (RDA) will present a brief overview of the 300 West Streetscape project. Improvements will include landscaped medians and intersection improvements, including bulb-outs and crosswalk enhancements, between approximately North Temple and 1000 North. The draft design guidelines are new and will supplement the current design guidelines for residential and commercial historic buildings and signs, reflecting best practice in information, guidance, organization and clarity. The Historic Landmark Commission will hold a Public Hearing, receive public comments, review the draft design guidelines and forward their recommendation to Planning Commission and City Council. Appeal Of Historic Landmark Commission Decision: The applicant, any owner of abutting property or of property located within the same H historic preservation overlay district, any recognized or registered organization pursuant to title 2, chapter 2.62 of this code, the Utah State Historical Society or the Utah Heritage Foundation, aggrieved by the Historic Landmark Commission's decision, may object to the decision by filing a written appeal with the appeals hearing officer within ten (10) calendar days following the date on which a record of decision is issued.
