2. <u>Pioneer Park Cultural Landscape Report</u> – The Public Lands Department is collaborating with the Planning and Engineering Divisions on cultural landscape reports (CLRs). These CLRs will provide new preservation tools for the long-range planning of Salt Lake city's significant historic and cultural landscapes. Cultural Landscape Reports, developed according to the <u>Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Historic Properties and the Guidelines for the Treatment of Cultural Landscapes</u>, provide site-specific guidance to decision makers. The applicant may object to the decision of the Historic Landmark Commission by filing a written appeal with the appeals hearing officer within thirty (30) calendar days following the date on which a record of decision is issued
