Briefing

1. **Mountain Accord Update** - Representatives from the City working on the Mountain Accord Project will provide an update to the Commission. Mountain Accord is a multi-phase initiative that seeks to make critical decisions regarding the future of the Central Wasatch Mountains. It will holistically evaluate and address issues and goals centered on four topic areas: environment, recreation, transportation, and economy. Mountain Accord is a collaboration between public and private interests, including state and local governments, federal agencies, and business and grassroots organizations. Input received from the public will be used to inform and guide the process. The desired outcome of the scenario planning process is an agreed-upon set of proposed actions to be carried forward to the next phase of planning and implementation.

Legislative Matters

- 2. Meridian Commerce Center Plat 2 Subdivision Amendment and Street Closure at approximately 4236 W Commercial Way- G&H Investments, LLC and Gloria B Rothwell, owners of property at 4324 W & 4236 W Commercial Way, are requesting a Subdivision Amendment to the Meridian Commerce Center Plat 2 located at approximately 4236 W Commercial Way. The subdivision amendment would remove approximately 5,500 square feet of the abutting right-of-way as the street turns and must also be reviewed through the Street Closure process. The portion of right-of-way proposed to be closed is located at the intersection of Commercial Way and Meridian Park Road, however both streets would remain open to vehicles and comply with the City standards for this type of street. The subject property is currently vacant and is zoned M-1, Light Manufacturing. This type of project must be reviewed as a Street Closure and Subdivision Amendment. - 3. Plan Salt Lake Mayor Ralph Becker is requesting that the City adopt a citywide vision plan that will help guide the future growth of the City. Plan Salt Lake is a policy document that does not create specific development regulations. The Planning Commission will make a recommendation to the City Council.
