

SALT LAKE ART DESIGN BOARD BUSINESS MEETING

Tuesday, April 24, 2012 from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m.

1. INTRODUCTIONS:

2. PROJECT UPDATES:

Ms. Thomas reported on the public art projects being managed by the Salt Lake City Public Art Program including:

Art in Transit – Ms. Thomas and Mr. Richards had been attending regular update meetings with Utah Transit Authority (UTA), the contractor, and architects. All the stations' artworks are underway and are on schedule for installation in late fall. The following TRAX station names were announced by UTA: North Temple Bridge/Guadalupe, Jackson Euclid, Fairpark, Power, 1950, and Airport.

Public Safety Building – The artists commissioned for the public art projects are still in the design phases of their projects and will be submitting engineering drawings for review and approval in the fall.

Flying Objects 3.0 – The artists have all received approval of their final designs from the project engineer and are beginning fabrication of their sculptures. She and Mr. Richards will make studio visits to all the artists in mid-May to check their progress. Installation of the new sculptures is scheduled for Saturday, June 16, in tandem with the removal of the current round of sculptures.

In conclusion, Ms. Thomas announced that the Public Art Program is currently managing 23 artists on the following projects; 4 at Public Safety Building, 6 for Art in Transit, 12 for Flying Objects 3.0, and 1 at Fire Station #6. This amounts to \$2,375,000 and of the 23 artists commissioned, 16 are from Utah.

3. UPCOMING PROJECTS OVERVIEW:

Ms. Thomas reported on two upcoming public art projects including:

9Line – CDBG (Community Development Block Grants) funding will be utilized for this project however, at this time the schedule has not been determined.

Utah Performing Arts Center (UPAC) – This project is at least 9 to 12 months out. The funding is not completely in place but it is hoped that 1% of construction budget will be designated for public art. MOCA Systems is managing the project.

4. OTHER BUSINESS / ADJOURN

David Warnock Painting

Ms. Thomas reported that a painting donated to Salt Lake City in 1998 by David Warnock was recently removed from the COW at the City & County Building because of new audio / video equipment that was recently installed. The painting has been relocated to the 5th floor in the Reception area of the City Attorney's office. Mr. Warnock was notified about the relocation.

Warm Springs Park

Ms. Thomas reported that the public art project in Warm Springs Park was vandalized sometime during the winter. Fourteen bronze plaques created by artist Kinde Nebeker were stolen from the concrete pillars on which they were installed. A report was filed by SLC Parks Department to Salt Lake City Police however, to date, no recovery of the plaques has been made. Ms. Thomas said she would research the cost and material options for new plaques.
