

The purpose of this report is to communicate the Building Services Division's workload and provide analysis of the trends to better understand staff capacity.

MONTHLY SUMMARY- A total of **660** permit applications were issued in December, this is 74 more than the previous month. Building Services received **654** applications throughout the month. The permits issued in December will add **14** housing units to Salt Lake City once the projects are complete.

Salt Lake City's Civil Enforcement Team currently has **853** open enforcement cases. This includes **166** current Boarding cases throughout the city.



^{*}QTA refers to our 'Quick Turn-Around Queue'. Our department uses this routing queue for small projects that we determine will take our staff under 30 mins to review. Examples of this would include a small bathroom remodel, a solar permit, or roofing permit.

Salt Lake City issued 9,190 permits in 2024, this is slightly lower than the past two years. However, this is not always the most accurate way of determining how busy our department was throughout the past year. The total value of projects permitted can also be a factor, as higher job values can indicate larger scale projects, which often leads to more complex reviews and increased number of inspections. The total project value for 2024 was \$3,370,854,818, which is more than a billion dollars higher than any year in Salt Lake City's history. This number could reflect the higher cost of construction supplies and labor, however, we continually noticed a rise in large scale projects such as multi-level apartment buildings, new distribution warehouses, and large scale tenant improvement projects.

2024 was another incredible year for the building services department, continuing to hit monthly all-time high records for our inspections department, maintaining a 14 day or less review period for all residential plan review, and several software updates.
