I. The meeting convened at 5:12 p.m. Chair Scott McCoy presided.

II. Approve minutes of January 10, 2005 Meeting:

Motion: Ms. Curry pointed out a date change in the minutes that was 1957 not 1967. Mr. Kioa moved and Mr. Levin seconded to approve the minutes as corrected for January 10, 2005, which motion carried, all members present voted aye.

III. New Business

a. Introduce and welcome new Administrator, Ty McCartney and new board member Daniel May.

Mr. McCartney said prior to accepting the position of Administrator for the Police Civilian Review Board, he worked for law enforcement agencies over the last 13 years in a variety of capacities. b. Review and approve quarterly board report for January 2005 through March 2005.

c. Discussion regarding possible Board review of complaints filed against dispatcher and other civilian police department employees.
