


## Police Civilian Review Board Procedure

### Disagreements with the Police Chief's Final Disposition

- A. There will be times when a panel of the Board will disagree with the Police Chief's final disposition. Sometimes these disagreements will be substantive and sometimes they will not. Disagreements will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- B. If there is disagreement about whether an officer should be exonerated or the complaint classified as unfounded, no action will be taken.
- C. If other disagreements occur, the Administrator will take the following action:
1. Contact the Police Chief to determine the rationale for his final disposition.
  2. Email that rationale to all panel members.
  3. Organize a conference call with the panel members to discuss the disagreement and the rationale. The panel may then direct the Administrator to do any of the following:
    - a. Take no action.
    - b. Draft a letter to the Chief expressing the panel's opinion.
    - c. Request a meeting with the Chief and/or his Executive Officer.
    - d. Draft a letter to the Mayor.
    - e. Take other action as determined by the panel.
