Cumulative Statistics

One-hundred and three case investigations have been completed since July 1, 2003. Forty-three of those cases contained multiple complaints against one or more officers. Attachment 1 is a list of all officers investigated showing the ethnicity/race and gender of the officers and the complainants. Attachment 2 contains the analysis of the complaints based on the race/ethnicity and gender of complainants and officers.

Since July 1, 2003, Two-hundred and two complaints have been referred from Internal Affairs. The Police Civilian Review Board has investigated One-hundred and three (51%) of the cases and has not investigated ninety-two (49%) of the cases. Among the One-hundred and three cases, there were one hundred and seventy complaints made and each one was investigated.

Analysis of Complainants

The overall sustain rate for all allegations is 43%. Of the 170 allegations investigated, 55 complainants have been people of color. Of the complaints filed by people or color, panels have recommended that seventeen (31%) be sustained, four (7%) no determination is possible, twenty-seven (49%) the officer should be exonerated, and seven (13%) unfounded. One hundred and fifteen complainants were Caucasian. Of those, panels recommended that fifty-six (49%) be sustained, ten (9%) no determination is possible, twenty-nine (25%) officer should be exonerated, and twenty (17%) unfounded.

Forty-eight complaints were filed by females. Of those, panels recommended that eighteen (38%) be sustained, four (8%) no determination is possible, sixteen (33%) officer should be exonerated, and ten (21%) unfounded. One hundred and twenty-two complaints were filed by males. Of those panels recommended that

fifty-five (45%) be sustained, ten (8%) no determination is possible, forty (33%) the officer should be exonerated, and seventeen (14%) unfounded.

Analysis of Civilian or Police Status of Complainant

One hundred and fifteen complaints were filed by civilians. Of those, panels recommended that thirty-five (30%) be sustained, seven (6%) no determination is possible, forty-eight (42%) officer should be exonerated, and twenty-five (22%) unfounded. Fifty-five complaints were filed by other police officers. Of those panels recommended that thirty-eight (69%) be sustained, seven (13%) no determination is possible, seven (13%) be exonerated, and three (5%) unfounded.

Analysis of Officers

Twenty-four complaints have been filed against officers of color. Of those, panels recommended that twelve (50%) be sustained, three (13%) no determination is possible, five (21%) officer should be exonerated, and four (17%) unfounded. One hundred and forty-six complaints were filed against white officers. Of those panels recommended that sixty-one (42%) be sustained, eleven (8%) no determination is possible, fifty-one (35%) officer should be exonerated, and twenty-three (16%) unfounded.

Eighteen complaints have been filed against female officers. Of those, panels have recommended that ten (56%) be sustained, three (17%) no determination is possible, three (17%) officer should be exonerated, and two (11%) unfounded. One hundred and fifty-two complaints have been filed against male officers. Of those, panels have recommended that sixty-three (41%) be sustained, eleven (7%) no determination is possible, fifty-three (35%) officer should be exonerated, and twenty-five (16%) unfounded.

Analysis of Use of Force

Sixty complaints alleged excessive use of force. Of those, panels recommended that three (5%) be sustained, five (8%) no determination is possible, forty-two (70%) officer should be exonerated, and ten (17%) unfounded.
