Trends/Issues Identified and Relayed to the Police Department

As noted in the cases that went to a full panel, see above, in seven of the twelve listed cases, the Board sustained the allegation(s). Now this reflects five carry over cases from the previous quarter, which had not been adjudicated by the SLCPD prior to the last quarter's report, but this indicates a significant uptick in the percentage of cases sustained over these past six months. In these cases, consisting of these past two quarters, no real trends could be determined and the cases each seemed to be isolated, individual failures by specific officers. Nothing systemic was noted related to an individual officer or even to a specific unit. There is some information that this will change next quarter.

A common theme in the past four years has been the misapplication or misunderstanding of Search and Seizure law as represented by the Amendment which is also covered by the SLCPD policy manual. That again seems to be present in cases currently being investigated that will be reported upon in the next Quarterly Report. As a trend, officers seem to be misapplying various recognized exceptions to the requirement to obtain a court issued search warrant. Examples of this are the misapplication of legal exceptions, or a lack of understanding of the same, such as Inventory Searches and Protective Sweeps while other unrecognized exceptions have been cited. The number of cases involving misunderstanding, misapplication or the apparent ignoring of Search and Seizure requirements indicate a need for Department wide training in this area. In addition to some immediate training addressing this area, the SLCPD should investigate formulating a regular way to keep this area of concern current, at least on a monthly basis until the number of "search" related complaints dramatically decreases. PCRB wants to point out that the need for a warrant is paramount while warrantless searches are only to be done when the specific situation is covered by one of the recognized, court tested, exceptions. Some units, such as the Narcotics Unit, generate numerous court issued warrants monthly while other units do not seem to generate nearly the same number or even percentage of warrants vs. warrantless, searches. It should be noted that the Narcotics Unit has yet to have had a complaint lodged against them on any search related matter, at least as far back as memory goes and this confirms that solid prior planning and a rigid adherence to policy reduce, if not eliminate, allegations of misconduct.

Only two complaints this quarter involved an allegation over the misuse of force, with one of those cases still pending and in the other, the officer was "exonerated". The SLCPD, which interacted with the "Occupy" movement on a daily basis for a lengthy period of time, did not have a single force complaint lodged which is perhaps a singular accomplishment nationwide. PCRB notes that the SLCPD is a national leader when it comes to "force" related matters as illustrated at the recent national convention of Police Oversight agencies.
