As a Council Member, I want to remind us of all the public services we rely on in our daily lives — water, power, sanitation, and essential infrastructure. These sustain the health and dignity of each resident and must reflect our values as a city: family, community, and collective care.

Recent news of a proposed proposed U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) detention facility in our region is deeply concerning. This type of infrastructure contradicts the principles of our communities and of Salt Lake City. We will explore every municipal lever available to push back against systems that undermine human dignity and exceed our currently planned infrastructure.

Public services and systems should serve life, not facilitate harm.

As a step to protecting resources for all residents, the Council adopted an amendment to City code related to water conservation, along with a temporary land use regulation, to help safeguard the local water supply. The amendment limits new high water-use developments and builds consistency with existing land use regulations. The City will continue to consider long-term zoning changes. The City also took steps to declare a stage 2 drought advisory, calling for a reduction of 10 million gallons of water per day.

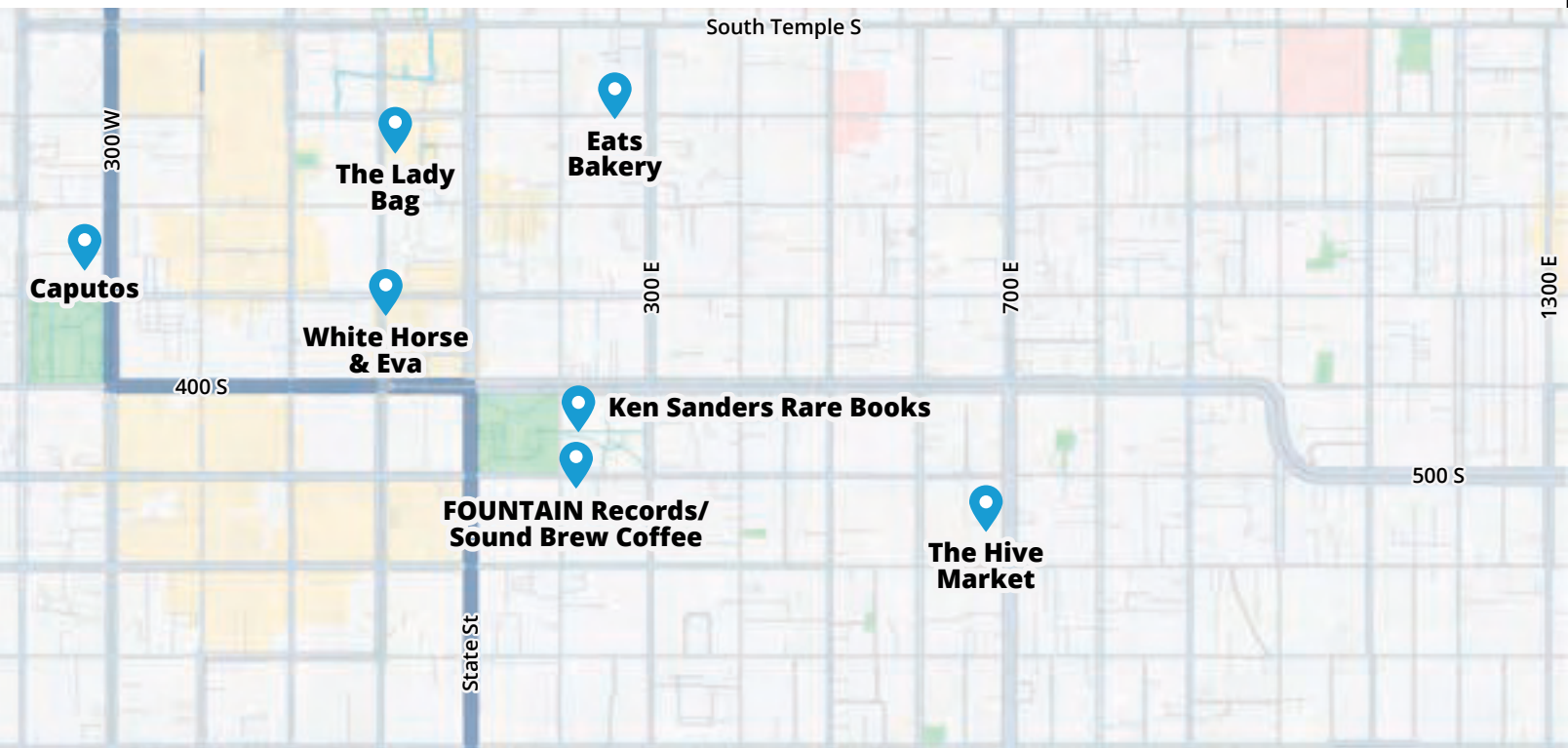




# Support your District 4 Businesses

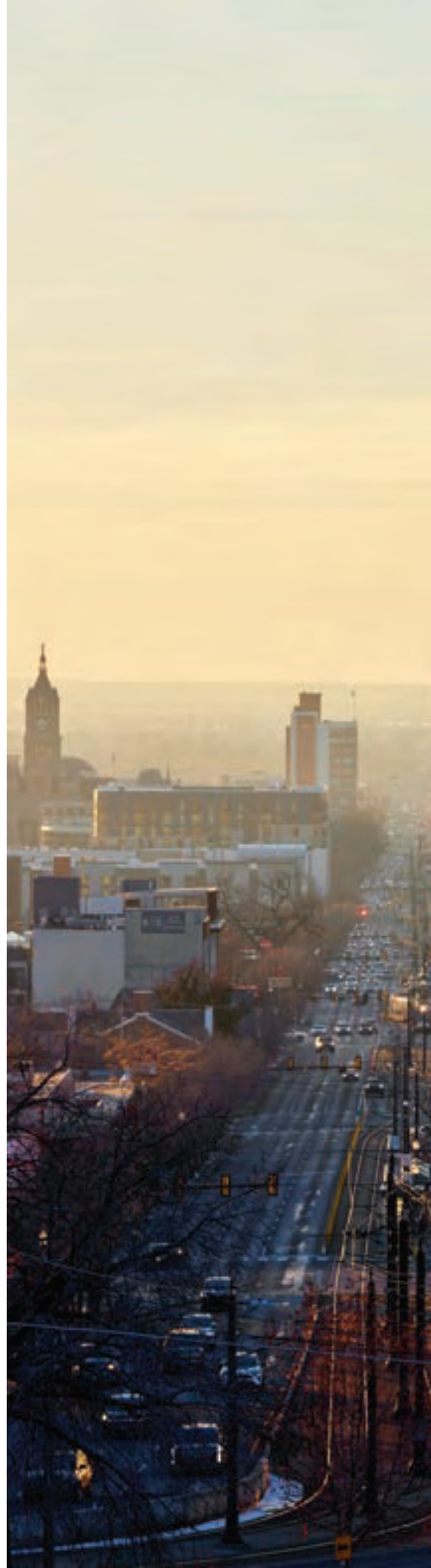
