## District 6 Park Updates



Exciting changes are happening in many of our parks! Here are a few updates:

- Construction at Donner Trail Park is expected to begin sometime in May.
- Sunnyside Park is currently in the design phase.
- Repairs to historic stone features, including the foundation of a double stairway off 900 S at Miller Park Bird Refuge Trail, will start this spring. Trail and creek-related work will follow in late summer/fall.

## Water Conservation



After a mild winter, and with warmer weather approaching, I want to remind you to do your part in conserving water — one of our most important resources as our city continues to grow.

More than 60 percent of our drinking water comes from mountain streams in the Wasatch. In the summer, that water is mixed with groundwater from wells maintained by the City to make sure there is enough for everyday use and fire protection.

Here are a couple of tips to keep in mind:

- Turn off the tap while you brush your teeth, shave, or wash your hands
- Only run your dishwasher or washing machine when they're full
- Repair leaky pipes or faucets
- Only water your lawn when needed. Check the weekly watering guide at [conservewater.utah.gov/](https://conservewater.utah.gov/)
