- **WHEREAS**, Salt Lake City is built on homelands of the Northwestern Shoshone, Paiute, Goshute, and Ute who have called the Salt Lake Valley and the Wasatch Range home and have been stewards of the land for thousands of years; and
- **WHEREAS**, Native Americans have contributed to the prosperity of Salt Lake City through treaties, resources, lands, culture, traditions and commerce; and
- **WHEREAS**, we honor and celebrate the importance of Native Americans and their immeasurable contributions to our City and to our society, distinguishing themselves as scholars, veterans, teachers, athletes, artists, entrepreneurs and leaders: and
- **WHEREAS,** we strive to improve communications with, services to, and partnership with all City residents as we journey together on a quest for justice, equality, respect and prosperity.

that the Salt Lake City Council and Mayor of Salt Lake City declare the month of November 2020 as Native American Heritage Month.
