MOTION 1 – EXTEND A LOCAL EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION

I move that the Council adopt a resolution extending a proclamation declaring a local emergency relating to a magnitude 5.7 earthquake, until December 9, 2020.

MOTION 2 – DECLINE TO EXTEND A LOCAL EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION

I move that the Council not adopt a resolution extending a proclamation declaring a local emergency relating to a magnitude 5.7 earthquake.



RESOLUTION NO. ____ OF 2020

Extension of Proclamation Declaring a Local Emergency: Magnitude 5.7 Earthquake

WHEREAS, under Utah Code 53-2a-208(1)(a), the chief executive of a municipality may declare a local emergency by proclamation, which proclamation may be in effect for up to 30 days.

WHEREAS, under Utah Code 53-2a-208(1)(b), any extension of the local emergency beyond the initial 30 days must be with the consent of the governing body of the municipality.

WHEREAS, under Salt Lake City Code 22.03.010, the Mayor may declare a local emergency by proclamation, and the proclamation must state: (i) the nature of the local emergency; (ii) the areas of the City that are affected or threatened; and (iii) the conditions which caused the local emergency.

WHEREAS, under Salt Lake City Code 22.03.020, any renewal of a proclamation of local emergency for a period beyond 30 days must be approved by the City Council, with such approval expressed by resolution.

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the Mayor issued a “Proclamation Declaring a Local Emergency” in response to a magnitude 5.7 earthquake experienced in the Salt Lake Valley on March 18, 2020 (“Proclamation No. 3 of 2020”), which was extended by the Council to expire on July 6, 2020.

WHEREAS, aftershocks and incoming property damage assessments continue in Salt Lake City, and the City Council has determined that extending the duration of the local emergency is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of Salt Lake City’s residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah, the following:

1. The Council approves the extension of Proclamation No. 3 of 2020 declaring a local emergency due to the magnitude 5.7 earthquake, which extension shall be from the date of this Resolution until October 9, 2020, unless later extended or terminated by subsequent resolution of the Council.
2. Prior to the issuance of any proclamation exercising emergency powers under City Code 22.03.030, the Mayor shall provide written notification to the Council of: (a) the specific powers the Mayor intends to exercise; (b) the justification for exercising such powers in connection with the local emergency; and (c) the anticipated effect of the exercise of such powers, including the anticipated cost or lost revenue to the City.
3. At any Council meeting while the local emergency is still in effect, the Council may seek additional information from the Mayor, including the actual effect of the exercise of any emergency powers and the actual costs or lost revenue to the City due to such exercise of powers.

4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage.



PROCLAMATION DECLARING A LOCAL EMERGENCY

Under Utah Code Sections 53-2a-208(1)(a) and 53-2a-209(1) and Salt Lake City Code Chapter 22.03, the Mayor of Salt Lake City hereby declares a local emergency.

On March 18, 2020, the Salt Lake Valley experienced a magnitude 5.7 earthquake.

This earthquake creates a state of local emergency under Utah Code and City Code.

Pursuant to Utah Code Section 53-2a-208(3) and City Code 22.03.010, the Salt Lake City Mayor makes the following proclamation declaring a local emergency:

1. Nature of the Local Emergency. A local emergency exists for Salt Lake City due to the magnitude 5.7 earthquake and its aftershocks. This local emergency threatens and affects the entirety of Salt Lake City.
2. Emergency Powers and Operations. The emergency powers and operations of Salt Lake City are hereby invoked and Salt Lake City's personnel and resources are ordered and authorized to perform all functions authorized by federal, state, and local law to address this local emergency.
3. Term. This proclamation shall take effect immediately and will be ongoing for thirty (30) days unless an extension is authorized by the Salt Lake City Council by resolution.
4. Assistance. Salt Lake City is authorized to request all assistance available with respect to this local emergency from all federal, state, and local sources and is authorized to activate all applicable mutual aid agreements.
5. Filing and Dissemination. This proclamation will be filed with the Salt Lake City Recorder and will be delivered to the State of Utah and Salt Lake County and will be disseminated to local media.
