## SPRING MAINTENANCE TIPS

- 1. Clean your rain gutters, and make sure water flows away from the house.
- 2. Uncover the evaporative cooler and turn on the water. or uncover the air conditioning condenser and make sure it's clean.
- 3. Check for moisture problems in the basement, crawlspace, ceilings etc.—especially around chimneys and outside windows.
- 4. Apply spring fertilizer.
- 5. Change the furnace filter.
- 6. Clean out dust behind the refrigerator and on refrigerator coils.
- 7. Clean out the dryer vent.
- 8. Change your smoke detector batteries.



## FALL MAINTENANCE TIPS

- 1. Clean gutters after the leaves fall and make sure water flows away from the house.
- 2. Turn off water supply, drain pan, cover evaporative cooler, and cover the air conditioner condenser.
- 3. Change the furnace filter.
- 4. Turn off water to sprinkler system. If the system doesn't have drains, blow out the system with air pressure.
- 5. Remove any leaves and debris from trees and shrubs.
- 6. On your final mowing, cut your grass shorter than in the summer.
- 7. Cover any shrubs or trees that are sensitive to cold.
- 8. Apply fall fertilizer.

#### **Year-round Furnace and Central** Air Conditioning Tips.

- 1. Change the filter at least quarterly. If you have pets, change the filter
- 2. Schedule a furnace tune-up annually.
- 3. Make sure all air ducts and return-air vents are clear and unobstructed.
- 4. Check weather stripping on doors and replace if needed.
- 5. Take advantage of utility programs that help cover the costs of insulation. You'll save money over the long term with smaller utility bills.
