Preliminary Concept Review

Salt Lake City and the Landmark Design Team has been working on planning and design efforts toward the creation of a comprehensive signage system for the City's Parks & Open Spaces for the past two months. This will be a review of the concepts developed to date. The purpose of this project is to first establish signage standards to enhance the user experience and site stewardship, which will be followed by the detailed design of specific signs for nine initial identified sites as follow:

- * Bonneville Shoreline Preserve
- * Bonneville Shoreline Trail
- * Ensign Peak
- * Hidden Hollow Natural Area
- * H-Rock Open Space
- * Jordan River Parkway
- * Miller Park Bird Refuge
- * Parley's Historic Nature Park
- * Wasatch Hollow Open Space

The project includes the design of more than 100 individual signs, which will address sign fabrication, installation and maintenance concerns. It is important that the signs are able to be reproduced and that replacements can withstand the effects of time, weather, and vandalism.

This meeting will be held **Thursday, January 23rd** at the Sorenson Unity Center (Black Box Theater) at 1383 S. 900 W., Salt Lake City. It will be Open House style with a presentation at 6:00 pm, but please stop in for as long as you can between 5:30 and 7:30 p.m.

All citizens are encouraged to come to this important meeting to provide feedback and ideas that will help guide the future Salt Lake City Open Space Signage Project.
