




December 2015 Wasatch Hollow CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



What are the boulders for? These boulders will play a significant role in our restoration project when they are placed as Rock Weirs for the water flow.

Rock weirs are a pile of stones lined up to slow down the flow of water on a slope. Rock Weirs are used to control and keep sediment from soil erosion from flowing downhill where soil has been exposed.

- They slow the velocity of the flow of water
 - They prevent sediment from flowing into other areas.
 - They aid infiltration of water into the soil by slowing water flow.
