

Certificate qualifications:

Community Science Advocate Award:

Attend at least one community science night to learn how to make quality observations. Complete 50 observations in your project park (Fife Wetland or Wasatch Hollow) during dusk hours (sunset – 2 hours after), including observations of at least 20 fauna and 10 flora. Observations must be made on at least five separate dates.

OR

Attend all 5 community science events for 2019 at your project park and make a collective of at least 25 observations at these events.

OR

Attend at least 4 out of 5 community science events for 2019 at your project park and make a collective of at least 20 observations at these events and recruit at least 2 new community scientists to attend an event and teach them how to collect quality data.

Most Valuable Community Scientist Award:

This award goes to the community scientist who meets the qualifications listed below as well as exemplifies commitment to community science as a whole, proper stewardship of public lands, and who inspires new paths in community science, through innovative ideas and bringing in new audiences:

- Completes qualifications for the Community Science Advocate Award (see above).
- Completes an additional 25 observations that are located both within and outside of their project park.
- Recruits an additional two new community scientists, either to attend events or by teaching them to make quality observations on their own.
