

Other Curbside Services

LEAVES-ONLY CAN COLLECTION



Residents can request an additional curbside compost can for surplus leaves during the fall months.

HOLIDAY TREE COLLECTION



Holiday trees that cannot fit into your curbside compost can are collected over two weeks every January. During this time, residents can place their tree at the curb or cut up in their curbside compost can for collection.

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUP



Every year a Neighborhood Cleanup day is provided to each city household. Items accepted are limited to waste that cannot fit in your curbside cans, such as branches, stumps and furniture. Residents are given notification by mail at least one month before their collection day.

Drop-off Specialty Items

Household Hazardous Waste & Electronic Waste (e-waste)

Household Hazardous Waste (paint, oil, batteries, pesticides, etc.) and Electronic Waste (anything with a plug) should be disposed of at the **Salt Lake County Hazardous Waste Recycling Facility** at 6030 West California Avenue.



Pharmaceutical Waste

Pharmaceutical waste should be disposed of at one of the **Salt Lake City Police Stations**. Do not flush down sink or toilet.

Fluorescent Light Tubes & CFLs

Fluorescent light tubes and CFLs can be dropped off at your nearest **Salt Lake County Library** or the **Salt Lake City-County Building**.



Mattresses

Mattresses can be dropped off at **Springback Utah** at 1989 S 4130 West, Suite C in SLC. Call (801) 906-8146 for details, including fees.
