Appendix C:

Irrigation-Only Meter Targets

Meters that are read only during non-winter months and that service only landscape r other outdoor features are referred to as irrigation-only accounts. Under the Department of Public Utilities rate structure, irrigation-only accounts receive a water-use target based on a number of factors, including, but not limited to the total area being irrigated, historical evapotranspiration data (ET), landscape coefficients, and demand levels, with each account receiving a unique target. The formula used to calculate each water-use target was developed by the Utah State University, utilizing local ET data.

Water used within the target will be billed, per unit, in Tier 2; water consumption exceeding the target will be billed, per unit, in Tier 3 or Tier 4, as appropriate.

All water customers receiving a water target should strive to maintain their irrigation system in optimum operating standards to maximize efficiencies and minimize water waste. During periods of declared water shortages, irrigation-only accounts may be called upon to make measurable reductions in outdoor water consumption so as to help in reducing overall water demand.
