

IT TAKES EVERYONE TO KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE

TRAFFIC CALMING & FOCUSED DRIVING

To minimize automobile crashes, we must all be consciously present and focused while driving.

Here are some things the City is working on to prioritize safety on our streets:

- Dedicating four new staff members in the Transportation Division to focus on speeding, traffic safety, and the **Livable Streets Program**
- Installing traffic calming tools to deter speeding like speed bumps and bump-outs
- Improving crosswalks including installation of flashing crosswalk signs and mid-street crosswalk signs
- Joining the Vision Zero network with the goal of eliminating traffic fatalities and serious injuries while focusing on safe and equitable mobility

In addition to the City's efforts, here are some things you can do to prevent distracted driving and help keep our roads safe:

- Plan out your route and check traffic conditions ahead of time.
- Avoid multitasking while driving. No eating, texting, or grooming.
- Keep items and passengers secure.
- Keep music at a reasonable level.
- Avoid driving when tired or drowsy.
- Keep windows and windshields clean for best visibility.

REFRESH WITH SOME SPRING CLEANING

Many of us are eager to freshen up our homes now that spring has arrived.

Here are a few safety tips for the spring-cleaning season:

Happy cleaning!



When using a ladder to clean hard-to-reach places, be sure the ladder has at least three points of contact for stability and is long enough so that you do not need to use the top step.



If cleaning out your rain gutter is on your to-do list, use a proper scooping tool and protection, including thick gloves and safety glasses, to keep you safe from bacteria.



If your trees need trimming, consider wearing gloves to protect your hands from cuts, boots to help maintain firm footing, and to be conscious and careful when using pruners and other sharp objects.



When cleaning with chemicals, remember to always read and follow the directions noted on the product, wear rubber gloves, and never mix cleaning solutions.
