And out of those 24, only 2 were constituent applications. I am here to highlight the Nevada Street Rebuild CIP application. This CIP reaches farther than just Nevada St. It will have a positive impact with a focus on safety, for so much of the east bench as so many families use this street for school pick up and drop off as well as after school and weekend activities. My name is Nicholas Wilkinson and I am a Trustee for the Beacon Heights neighborhood as part of the Sugar House Community Council. In being one of the trustees for this neighborhood since 2020, I have heard a lot about Nevada St It is a direct thoroughfare for two schools and is in a neighborhood of four total schools. (Hillside Middle School, Cosgriff Elementary, Beacon Heights Elementary, and Foothill Montessori of Salt Lake). There have been an increasing number of safety the years. As a background. Nevada St. has been on the list of streets that need work since 2018. Now currently sitting at an OCI overall condition index in the low teens (13). The reason I titled this CIP "Nevada St. Rebuild" is that, that is the first thing that needs to happen to properly implement the safety improvement. ADA compliant ramps, painted crosswalks, coordinated updated signage, and updated curbs for drainage as there is standing water. I am more than satisfied by how these services are delivered, and I totally understand the need for increased revenue to fund them. That said, people like myself are sharing more than our share of the burden. I am a widowed senior, living alone with a very modest lifestyle. I subscribe to the smallest available garbage container (40 gallons) that I have collected once EVERY 6-8 WEEKS (and it is never full); my recycling bin is put out never more than 1x/month; compost nearly all my kitchen and yard waste so the "brown bin" is only used in the fall when I collect leaves from the street (the city's responsibility, but you're a bit slow) that I don't want to put on my vegetable gardens. Modern technology should easily allow you to know how often (and how much) my waste is collected. Can't I be billed accordingly? The only incentive we have to contribute less waste to the system is the tiered rate of the garbage containers and that rate favors the largest users—they get 2.25 more capacity for 0.5 more cost. Currently, the pavement on our street holds a condition rating of just 16 out of 100, which speaks for itself. The gutters are no longer functioning properly and regularly collect stagnant water, creating a breeding ground for mosquitoes and posing a potential health concern.
