City Council Meeting Highlights

Tuesday, Aug. 13, 2024

Sports, Entertainment, Culture, and Convention District Zoning

The Council received a follow-up briefing on the proposed rezone for the Sports, Entertainment, Culture, and Convention District. Council Members took informal polls to indicate support for:

- A 600 ft maximum building height, with buildings above 200 ft required to go through the design review process, including Planning Commission review
- Allowing maximum front yard setback for the purpose of adding plazas or other similar uses
- Various adjustments to sign overlay pertaining to display standards

The Council also held a public hearing on the proposed rezone and will vote on this proposal at a later date.

Capital Improvement Program

The Council continued reviewing Capital Improvement Program projects tonight and will officially vote to allocate project funding at the next Council meeting on Aug. 27. CIP provides funding for citywide community projects that enhance public property, such as streets, parks, and buildings. Resident feedback on project requests was accepted during public hearings on July 9 and August 13.

 Landfill site.
 - <u>Truth in Taxation</u> (triggered by property tax changes for the City's General Fund and the City Library).
- Appointed Tricia Pil to the Library Board.
- Received a briefing and approved a \$75,000 <u>Economic Development Loan Fund</u>
 loan for Policy Kings Brewery, LLC., Utah's first Black-owned brewery. The loan will
 help the brewery relocate to Salt Lake City (925 South Jefferson Street) from Cedar
 City, retain five jobs, and create 15 new jobs.
