### The Council also:

- The Council also:
- Received an update from the Administration regarding a temporary closure of the Jordan River Trail on Utah State Fairpark property to facilitate crowd management and safety at the Utah State Fair. The Administration indicated that the City will use the closure to increase cleaning along the trail, allow vegetation to grow, and will coordinate with the PD to provide surrounding areas with additional presence.
- Held the first of three planned discussions to clarify the [legislative intents](#) (formal requests to the Administration) adopted with the Fiscal Year 2024-25 city budget. These help shape policy discussions prior to future budget deliberations and potential ordinance changes.
- Received a briefing, accepted public comment, and approved portions of Budget Amendment No. 1 to the [FY24-25 city budget](#). Other budget amendment #1 items will be considered at future meetings.
- Learned about [a proposal](#) to require a minimum 350-foot buffer between new gas stations and water bodies and parks or open spaces larger than one acre. A public hearing on this item is scheduled for Sept. 17, at 7 p.m.
- Received a briefing on the proposed [Northpoint Light Industrial Zoning District](#), which would help implement the Northpoint Small Area Plan's vision and goals. A public hearing on this item is scheduled for Oct. 1, at 7 p.m.
- Note: previous Council materials indicated that the Council would consider acting on the rezone at [754 S. State Street](#) at tonight's meeting. The City Attorney's office has advised that because the Council straw polled support for a development agreement that has the potential for requirements that are less restrictive than

the base zoning, it will go to the Planning Commission for a recommendation on that aspect. The Planning Commission could discuss this in early October with council action immediately following.
