Housing Funding Updates

The Council, acting as the Community Reinvestment Agency Board, approved \$11.5 million for new housing projects. These include:

- \$5.3 million in affordable housing from <u>Housing Development</u>
 <u>Loan Program</u> funds.
- \$2.9 million in funding for the <u>Community Development</u>
 <u>Corporation</u> of Utah's Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Financing Program.
- \$3.2 million for applications to the Residential Wealth-Building program.

The Council also began discussing how to maximize nearly \$8 million of federal Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds. The Council

will finalize specific projects and award amounts in April.
