## Stormwater Pollution Prevention - Property Management

- **4** Parking Lot Sweeping & Maintenance:
  - Sweep parking lots in the spring, fall, and as needed throughout the year, taking care to properly dispose of the swept materials (such as trash/dirt/asphalt/leaves).
  - Clean and maintain parking lot areas where vehicle fluid may have leaked, or where vehicle maintenance has been conducted; encourage the use of dry absorbent for spills and absorbent pads or pans during maintenance.
  - <u>Storm Drain Box Maintenance:</u>
    - Inspect and clean parking lot storm drains and any gutters/ditches that convey runoff in the spring, the fall, and as needed throughout the year.
  - <u>Salt Piles & Snow Removal:</u>
    - Cover salt piles when not in active use; salt must be kept away from storm drains or gutters/ditches where stormwater may flow.
    - Use salt/ice-melt sparingly and properly dispose/reuse any remnant material (do not leave it out if no longer needed).
    - Ensure that plowed/shoveled snow is placed on a vegetated/pervious surface; it is not sufficient to push snow into the street or leave piled in a parking lot as that snow has become polluted with salt/vehicle-fluids/trash/etc. and will discharge when it melts.
  - <u>Pet Areas/Pet Waste:</u>
    - Provide collection bags for pet waste and include signage that encourages proper collection and disposal.
    - Provide garbage cans for proper pet waste disposal and ensure this receptacle is maintained to prevent overflow of waste/bags.
    - Pick up and dispose of all remaining pet waste prior to storm events.
    - If rinsing/washing pet areas, always collect the wastewater and dispose of it in the sanitary sewer.
  - Building Washdown/Painting:
    - Contain and collect wash water and properly dispose of wastewater and excess paint.
  - Waste Containers:
    - Keep lid closed on all waste containers/dumpsters to protect from wind/rain; encourage recycling where able.
  - ¥ Yard Maintenance:
    - Use fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides per manufacturers recommendations.
    - Collect and properly dispose of all lawn clippings and yard debris.
    - Do not blow lawn clippings or leaves into the street/gutter.
  - Protect Storm Drain Boxes From Sewer Overflow:
    - Educate/encourage residents to avoid flushing sanitary wipes and prohibit them from pouring fats, oils, and grease down drains to reduce the risk of clogging and possible sewer overflows.
    - Adequately maintain all sewer infrastructure (lift stations, pump houses, etc.) at a frequency that prevents blockages and overflows.
